Pancakes, Lent and all that!

I hope you all enjoyed your pancakes on Pancake Day. They always go down a treat in our house. It's something of a tradition; the family simply do not like to Shrove Tuesday go by without their helping of pancakes sprinkled in sugar, doused in lemon juice and in some cases with a liberal helping of golden syrup! This year was no exemption and two batches of batter later we had one or two stomachs!

So what is it all about? Why Pancakes? Why Shrove Tuesday? It is all to do with the season of Lent, a period of 40 days (excluding Sundays) prior to Easter and of course traditions dating back to the customs of the mediaeval church. Lent was customarily a season of fasting, when Christians would do without dairy products and meat. That may sound harsh but let us remember that these customs grew out of the Church in mediaeval Europe. Even in warmer climes such as those that border the Mediterranean it is still winter and fresh produce is in short supply anyway. The minimum of livestock were over wintered to save on winter feed. Only those designated for breeding were kept, the others were slaughtered and the meat preserved as hams or salt beef. The milk cow had probably dried up by now as she waited to calve in the spring; cheese was the only way of preserving dairy products over any length of time. And the hens would have long stopped laying with short winter days. The vegetable garden too would be pretty sparse so late winter brought its own austerity anyway.

Shrove Tuesday is the day before Lent begins. In French it is known as *Mardi Gras* or *Fat Tuesday*. A day to use up the fat or butter before the season of fasting. So that is where the Pancakes come in, a simple recipe of flour, eggs and milk mixed together and fried in butter was an easy and (in my mind at least) a tasty way to rid the cupboard of any dairy products. Shrove points us to the religious side of the day. Shrove is the past tense of shrive a verb that means to confess sins and to receive forgiveness of those sins, a time perhaps to spring clean the soul. The French name for Shrove Tuesday connects us to Carnival. This was traditionally the Sunday before Lent. The name derives directly from the Latin which means “farewell to meat” and hence Carnival or *farewell to meat Sunday*. One last chance to celebrate before the 6 weeks of austerity kicked in.

The Mardi Gras Carnivals of New Orleans, the Caribbean and Latin America have long lost their religious associations.

So why a fast? The forty days of Lent mirror the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and praying. For Christ that time was a period of preparation before commencing his earthly ministry. And so too Lent; a time to abstain and to reflect and to pray in preparation for the great feast of Easter. This was traditionally the time that candidates for Baptism were prepared for their confession of faith and their entry into the family of the Church. We perhaps trivialise the abstinence of Lent when we give up chocolate or some other indulgence for the period. The purpose of giving up was always to take up. Less time preparing food allowed more time for prayer and reflection.

So why bother with this at all? A year in our lives takes a toll on our spiritual state. Compromises made, a path trodden that may as well not have been trodden, wrong decisions, smut picked up from our journey just as our day to day physical journey leaves us grubby and ready for a wash. Just as Spring is the time to give the house a good airing and a clean through so Lent is a time to give our spiritual house (that's soul to you and me) a spring clean. A time to reflect, to pray and to focus on Christ "The author and finisher of our faith". Time to prepare to give ourselves in service just as Jesus gave himself for us.

To think of it another way Lent is a time for washing and feeding. We all take the time to wash the stains of living off of our clothes and off of our skins. The grubbier the activity the more effort we have to take in washing (just take a look in our utility room sink after two boys come in from rugby training, let alone the state of the bath!), so too with Lent. It is a time to wash away the spiritual grime we pick up in life. And it is a time to feed the soul as well. Few of us go without food by choice and by and large our bodies do fairly well on a mixed diet (some good and healthy, some less so). Lent is a time to feed the soul with some choice healthy food, a time to build up and prepare.

So what if you have no faith? Or faith is something of a mystery to you? No matter Christ loves you and died for you so that you too can enjoy the privilege of his love. That is the starting point, so you too can take time to reflect, refresh and focus during Lent.

So may God bless you this season as you take time to focus on him, his great deeds, and his love for you and his will for your life?

Fairtrade / Traidcraft

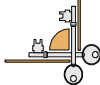

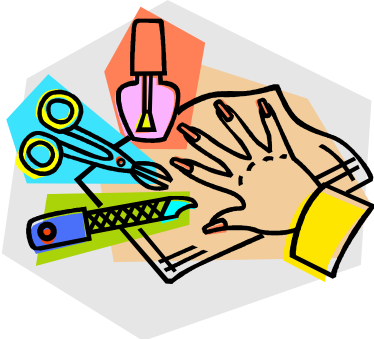
